Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Application (for students already enrolled at Longwood University)

Longwood's Nursing Program is designed as a four-year program with entry at the freshman level. Occasionally, space is available for current Longwood students to transfer into the Nursing Program. There is no guarantee space will be available for students to transfer into the major.

Students accepted by transfer into the Nursing Program will begin at the freshman level. As space is available, those students who have completed Biology 206 and 207: Human Anatomy and Physiology I and II with a grade of C or better may be considered for sophomore entry.

Applications to transfer into nursing will be reviewed for admission to the program prior to the start of the upcoming semester. Applications for spring semester will be due December 1; applications for fall semester will be due July 1.

The Nursing Admissions Committee will review applicants' high school and college transcripts, SAT/ACT scores, and personal statements. To be considered for admission, applicants must have the following:

- Preferred high school GPA of 3.2;
- Minimum composite score of 1000 on Redesigned SAT, with a minimum scaled score of 500 on the math portion/minimum composite score of 20 on ACT;
- Preferred BIOL 206, 207 or CHEM 111 and MATH 171 with a grade of C or better
- Minimum college GPA of 2.75; preferred college GPA of 3.0 or higher.
